

## ADALINE KETTELL FRANK

Adaline Kettell was born in Newburyport, Mass., April 21, 1798. She came to Michigan in 1835. Was married to Col. John Frank, March 1<sup>st</sup>, 1849 being his second wife. She was a woman of high Christian character and good moral worth, having been for many years an honored member of the Universalist Church, always taking great Interest in the welfare of the church of her choice.

On December 5<sup>th</sup>, 1883, she received a severe injury from a fall, which rendered her a helpless invalid, and from which she never recovered. After three long years of suffering and pain, which she bore with great fortitude and Christian patience, she quietly and peacefully passed away, surrounded by loving and tender hearts, on the evening of November 21<sup>st</sup>, 1886. Her funeral services were attended from her late home in South Avon, Wednesday, the 24<sup>th</sup> ult., Rev. James Gorton, of Charlotte, officiating.
