

## GEORGE G. LOMASON

George G. Lomason, familiar known as 'Doc', died at his home on North Walnut Street last Wednesday, Dec 5, 1901, aged 73 years. Mr. Lomason was a native of New Jersey, coming to Rochester with his father's family 54 years ago. From 1861 to 1880, or for 19 years he was the popular landlord of the Lambertson House, now Hotel St. James and had a wide acquaintance with the traveling public from far and near. By his hearty, wholesouled manner he made friends by the score who will receive the news of his death with regret. Mr. Lomason's wife died (Dorothy L.) 3 years ago, since which time he made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Frank Stone.

Mr. Lomason was one of the first water commissioners of the city and was always identified with the best interests and welfare of the town. No man contributed more to the securing of the Bay City Railroad for Rochester than did 'Doc' Lomason, and his purse was always open for improvements in every direction.

He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Stone, two brothers, Isaac and Phillip Lomason, and one sister, Mrs. J. D. Elliott all of Rochester. Funeral services will be held at the home tomorrow (Saturday) afternoon, at 1 o'clock, under Masonic allspices.
