

FAVOR E. BROMLEY SPRAGUE

Favor E. Sprague, wife of Rollin Cooper Sprague, died at her home 42 Holden Ave., Detroit, Mich., Saturday, Sept. 3rd, 1898.

Mrs. Sprague for many years had been in ill health and six months ago was obliged to take her bed where she lay in great suffering until the day of her death. She is survived by her husband and two daughters Mrs. C. R. Cox and Mrs. F. G. Coryell, both of Detroit. Mrs. Sprague was the youngest child of the late Bethuel Bromley, of this county. She was born at the homestead three miles north of this village, March 25, 1847, and was married at the same home November 24th, 1869, to Rollin Cooper Sprague. After a short residence in Rochester the family removed to Detroit where they have resided for 22 years. The deceased is also survived by her mother, Mrs. Eliza Bromley, who is in good health at the age of 92 years; and her brothers Martin, of Shelby, and Edward Bromley, of Avon, sisters Mrs. Charlotte Allen of Chicago; Mrs. N. Baldwin, Mrs. C. Baldwin, and Mrs. Wm. Burbank, all of Owosso, Mich.; and Miss Nette Bromley of Detroit. The funeral took place from residence at 12:45pm on Monday, Sept. 5th, the burial at the Rochester Cemetery the remains being accompanied by the immediate family and a few intimate friends. Mrs. Sprague was a member of St. Joseph's Memorial Church, Detroit, the services being conducted by the rector, Rev. L. A. Arthur.
