

ANGELINE L. UNDERWOOD

Angeline L. Underwood died August 16, 1901, at the home of her sister, Mrs. George Sipperley, with whom she had lived for two years.

Miss Underwood was born May 22nd in Avon, Oakland Co., Michigan. She was the oldest daughter of Asa and Sabrina Underwood, pioneers of Michigan; with whom she shared the hardships of the early settlers of this state. She was a most devoted daughter and sister, giving all of her time and strength to her relatives; in later years, especially, to her youngest sister and a niece.

Miss Underwood possessed a cheerful nature and a loveable disposition. She was a favorite aunt among her nieces and nephews. Of a family of eleven children only two survive Miss Underwood, Mrs. Sipperly or Rochester and Mrs. Emma Bird of Albuquerque, New Mexico.

The funeral was held last Sunday afternoon, Rev. W. F. Willmot, of Detroit, Officiating.
