

SARAH S. BLINN WEIR

The remains of Mrs. William J. Weir of Detroit, were brought to Rochester last Thursday, accompanied by her sorrowing husband and daughter. Several weeks ago Mrs. Weir suffered with a bunion and was treated for it with apparent relief. Last Monday a change was manifest and a physician summoned, who said her heart was badly affected and that death must ensue within a few hours. It is thought that blood poisoning set in, striking the heart. She died on Tuesday night (April 19, 1898). Mrs. Weir was a native of the State of New York (b June 25, 1838), coming to Rochester in 1862. Herself and husband removed to Detroit in 1884. John J. Blinn, of Rochester, is a brother to the deceased lady. She leaves besides her husband and daughter, (Mrs. M. B. Salter, of Ithica) an aged mother now in her 90th year, Mrs. Weir was a lady whom all delighted to honor, and her many friends in this, her old home, regret her death exceedingly. She was in her 68th year.
