

WILLIAM J. WEIR

The remains of the late William J. Weir, who died in Detroit last Tuesday (Nov. 6, 1899) were brought to Rochester for interment. His age was 71 years. Up to the time of his leaving Rochester fifteen years ago, Mr. Weir was closely identified with the business, municipal and social affairs of the town. He served many years on the school and village boards, besides being president of the village several terms. He was engaged in the hardware business up to the time of his removal to Detroit a greater share of his time since being devoted to the insurance business. Mr. Weir was a man of commanding ability, of genial manners, a finished orator and many old friends will learn of his death with regret. He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Marvin Salter, of Ithica, his wife having died nearly two years ago. The services were largely attended from the Universalist Church on Wednesday morning, Rev. Lee McCollester of Detroit officiating.
